Carole Simpson, a former ABC news anchor who is now a journalism professor at Emerson College, is on the hot seat after endorsing **Hillary Clinton** for president at a New Hampshire political rally. Simpson said she immediately regretted her actions and offered her resignation the day after the October rally in Salem, N.H., to which she took her 14-student journalism class, but Emerson officials refused to accept it.
