Addison Trail students took the PSAE tests on April 23rd & 24th. We expect to have results back by the end of May/beginning of June. We will host a parent night on **Thursday, May 29, 2014 in Forum Room A at 6:00 pm.** to help interpret the **PLAN** (for freshmen) and **ACT** (for sophomore & juniors) tests results. **Parents that attend will receive copies of their student's scores.** Student course selection is the #1 predictor of success on the ACT. Parents will also receive information on how they can help their students raise their scores.

College Corner

Juniors, now is the time to start planning to visit colleges! Listed below are a few ideas to make your college visits successful and prepare for college planning in the fall.

- Visit colleges over the summer to determine admission requirements, take a campus tour, ask about financial aid opportunities, and meet with an admission counselor.
- Consider writing your college essays during the summer.
- Complete and return the Transcript Release Authorization and High School Resume/Recommendation Data Form.
- At the start of your senior year, request letters of recommendations .
- Most college applications need to be completed online.
- All requests for supplemental materials (transcripts/letters of recommendations/etc.) must be done by October 15, 2014.

DUPAGE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICE BLOCK GRANT SCHOLARSHIP The CSBG Scholarship is designed, in cooperation with the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, to provide financial assistance to low-income and disadvantaged person of high academic attainment or potential. Applicants must be CSBG income eligible (guidelines available with application), a DuPage Country resident, enrolled/accepted at Illinois accredited higher educational or occupational training institute and possess a minimum cumulative 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale. Applications are available in the Guidance Office. The deadline is May 2, 2014.

MISS ADDISON SCHOLARSHIP

The Village of Addison will award three females between the ages of 17-21 a Scholarship for the 2014-2015 academic year based on the eligibility /requirements stated in the application. Miss Addison will receive \$1000 Scholarship, First Runner Up will be awarded a \$500.00 Scholarship and Second Runner Up will be awarded a \$250.00 Scholarship. Do's and Don'ts on writing the college application essay

<u>Do's</u>

-Keep your focus narrow and personal

Your essay must prove a single point or thesis. The reader should be able to find your main idea and follow it from beginning to end. Ask someone to read just your introduction to see what he or she thinks your essay is about.

-Prove it

Develop your main idea with vivid, specific facts, events, quotations, examples, and reasons. There's a big difference between simply stating a point of view and letting an idea unfold in the details.

-Be Specific

To avoid clichéd, generic, and predictable writing, use vivid, specific details

<u>Don'ts</u>

-Don't tell your readers what you think they want to hear

Most admissions officers read plenty of essays about the charms of their university, the evils of terrorism, and the personal commitment involved in being a doctor. Bring something new to the table, not just what you think they want to hear.

-Don't write a resume.

Don't include information that is found elsewhere in the application. Your essay will end up sounding like an autobiography, travelogue, or laundry list.

-Don't use 50 words when 5 will do

Eliminate unnecessary words.

-Don't forget to proofread

Typos and spelling or grammatical errors can be interpreted as carelessness or just bad writing. Don't rely on your computer's spell-checker.
