Educational Focus Items for April 29, 2019

Assistant Superintendent Mrs. Jean Barbanente highlighted the educational focus items for the April 29 Board meeting, which will include New Textbook Requests for 2019-20 and classroom textbook sets and supplemental instructional materials to be purchased through grant funds.

Behavioral Interventions Policies

Mrs. Barbanente presented the Behavioral Interventions Committee's recommendations for handbook revisions for the 2019-20 school year. Mrs. Barbanente also highlighted the district's Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS), restorative practices and data trends.

Board Meeting Calendar for 2019-20

Superintendent Dr. Scott Helton presented a draft of the 2019-20 Board Meeting Calendar, which is similar to the Board's 2018-19 calendar. The calendar will be brought to a later Board meeting for approval.

Medical & Dental Insurance Program Renewal for 2019-20

Chief Financial Officer Mr. Edward Hoster presented the medical and dental insurance premium renewal rates for the 2019-20 school year. The rates reflect increases for the PPO medical and dental programs, while the HMO medical programs have increased and the HMO dental program remains the same. These increases are due to the district's actual loss ratio compared to the EBC Pool that we purchase insurance from.





The Educational Benefit Cooperative (EBC) has introduced some new benefit program strategies to encourage employees to make informed decisions regarding their health care and control claim costs, e.g., Telemedicine - in its fourth year; and Member Rewards Program - implemented in December 2018.

Preliminary Property Tax Extension 2018

Mr. Hoster reviewed the property tax extension, which serves for the 2019-20 school year, and highlighted some of the changes from the prior year. The total increase is \$1,280,184, or 2.39 percent over the prior year. The Equalized Assessed Valuation (EAV) continues to reflect the real estate market recovery, with an increase of 5.06 percent, which brings the district closer to the level back in 2005.
