

INTRODUCTION to 2D

This is a general introductory art course which deals with the principles of two dimensional design and composition. Students will learn drawing, painting, cartooning and computer art completing still life drawings, portraits, digital drawing, design and cartoons. Significant 2-D art from the past and present will be explored.



INTRODUCTION to 3D

This is an introductory, **3**-dimensional art course designed to be welcoming for students of all artistic experience levels. Students will learn the elements of art and the principles of 3-dimensional design and composition through a variety of art projects in <u>sculpture</u>, <u>pottery</u>, and <u>jewelry</u>. Students will learn to work with clay, wire, glass, foam, and found objects.


This course (or Intro to **2**-D) is a prerequisite for jewelry and clay classes. *Semesters:* **1**

GRAPHIC DESIGN 1 and 2

These courses explore the use of computer-generated art as an introduction to the computer as an artistic tool. Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator and InDesign are the software programs that will be used to alter and manipulate images and typography in order to create strong designs and compositions.

You will make CD packages, concert posters and tickets, portraits, photo collages, optical illusions, logo symbol design, letterhead mailers, magazine covers, restaurant menus, candy box designs and digital images. *Semesters: 1 each*

No prerequisite – This class may be taken as a Freshman






This is a course that explores both traditional and imaginative drawing techniques and materials. You will learn the fundamentals of sketching and drawing using a variety of media including pencil, pen and ink, pastels, colored pencils, markers, and charcoal. Projects include still lives, landscapes, portraits, figure drawing, abstract designs and animal sketching. Semesters: 1 each Prerequisite: Intro to 2-D or 3-D. Prerequisite waived for seniors



Clay 1, 2 and 3






Animation and Cartoon Drawing 1 and 2

This course will introduce students to basic drawing techniques in the field of cartooning and animation. Single-panel cartoons, editorial cartoons, caricatures, original characters, <u>comic strips</u>, comic books/graphic novels will be learned . A drawn animation with storyboards will be filmed and edited using the computer. You will learn <u>claymation</u>, cut-paper animation, character development, <u>storyboarding</u>, publishing, <u>filming</u> and editing.



ADVANCED ANIMATION

If you are interested in going into the **growing field** of animation you need to have a block of studio time to produce animations to be used for scholarship opportunities and admission into art schools. Advanced Animation allows you to have time to work on an in-depth semester long project. In addition to working in a more independent manner, you will learn new computer software that allows you to add special effects and sound layers to their animations.

Past student films created during this class have been featured in The Ottawa Animation Festival in Canada and Chicago Youth Film Festival. Prerequisite: Animation 1 / Animation 2 or instructor's permission. Semesters: 1 (may also be taken for 2 semesters)

Jewelry and Sculpture


This course is designed for students to explore **3**-Dimensional art and design on both a small and large scale. Original art jewelry will be created in **glass, copper, brass, silver, and semi-precious stone setting,** and original sculpture will be explored in <u>clay, wood, wire, glass,</u> <u>plaster, and found objects</u> with an emphasis on creativity, composition, and craft. Both additive and subtractive jewelry and sculpture processes will be explored along with mold making processes.

Prerequisite: Intro to Art ${f 3}$ -D or Intro to Art ${f 2}$ -D.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT STUDIO ART 2 Honors Credits

The Advanced Placement Studio offers a choice of AP Drawing, AP **2**-D Design, and AP **3**-D Design. These classes are intended for independent art students who wish to develop individual skills, style, and technique along with a <u>portfolio</u> of work. This course is meant to provide students with an experience equivalent to a college level foundations class.

Students will work on self-directed as well as teacher-directed assignments and will learn how to shoot professional quality photographs of their work. The Advanced Placement Art Exam is offered in May at an additional cost.

Semesters: 2 – A year long class with Honors credit
