#### **EDUCATIONAL FOCUS ITEMS:**

• Mrs. Maria Salvatore, Addison Trail Interdisciplinary Teams Coordinator, presented an update of the implementation of Smaller Learning Communities now in the fourth year. The Freshman House system includes four core and one honors section that combine students in English, science and social studies classes. The Sophomore House system is being piloted and schedules students in common English, science and math classes. At the junior level, the research project has been extended year long to provide more support for students.

**Thursday School Intervention** has been introduced to provide academic support for all freshmen, sophomore and ESL students who are referred by teachers. This program has achieved a high attendance rate and focuses content bi-weekly on math and science as well as English, ESL, social studies and reading. Two additional visits are planned to Portland and San Antonio for staff to **observe best practices and determine implementation strategies for thematic academies** in the 2009-2010 school year.

**Mr. Dan Krause,** Willowbrook Principal, reported that the core team has been reviewing how to implement SLC next year with the incoming freshman class to ensure a successful transition to the high school. An **advisory component** will be added to the schedule in the freshman year. The long-term focus is to build the curriculum for the next three years and provide a **post-secondary experience in a student's senior year**.

• Mrs. Beth Yacobi, Director of Curriculum & Learning, presented seven years of student enrollment data for Advanced Placement courses that demonstrates a growth trend. The numbers have increased significantly by communicating expectations and encouraging students to enrich themselves through the AP curriculum. She also noted the official course ledger at each school as authorized by the recent AP College Board Course audit.

Addison Trail Principal Dr. Scott Helton highlighted recent events and recognition:

- Alumnus Gary Ofenloch was honored with the Tradition of Excellence Award. Mr. Ofenloch returned to Addison Trail for a day of speaking presentations with students and staff.
- Approximately 150 senior citizens attended the Kiwanis Senior Thanksgiving luncheon.
- More than 1,600 cans of food were collected and donated during the annual food drive.
- Upcoming events include: Student of the Quarter breakfast, Senior Art Exhibit and the holiday benefit concerts.

#### Willowbrook Principal Mr. Dan Krause highlighted recent events and recognition:

- Over 700 parents pre-registered and attended Parent/Teacher conferences.
- The fall production of "The Importance of Being Earnest" earned rave reviews and was well attended.
- The Speech team placed 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 27 teams at the Lake Forest tournament.
- Upcoming events include: Student Council annual blood drive and holiday concerts.
