

2. Participants violating II-H for a second time will be ineligible for one calendar year from the date of the second infraction.
  3. Participants violating II-H for a third time will be declared ineligible for all activities/athletics/for the remainder of his/her high school career.
  4. ~~While on Code suspension students will be expected to practice and to attend their school sponsored team/activity events.~~ If a student is disruptive in either of these environments, they may be excluded at the discretion of the athletic director, sponsor(s), coach and the building principal.
- D. Any member of the student activities program who *presents* himself/herself to the director of athletic/student activities as having a substance abuse problem will have full practice and participating privileges as long as the following conditions are deemed applicable by the school administration:
1. Admission of the said abuse is not initiated by the participant as a means of escaping disciplinary action
  2. Participant and parent(s) receive medical counseling, the cost of which to be paid solely by the parent(s) at a recommended treatment center
  3. Participant and parent(s) successfully complete such medical counseling.
  4. Participant does not violate II-H after he/she admits said abuse.

#### IV. Consequence Appeal Process

Students may appeal the decision of the Director of Athletics/Student Activities provided the appeal is filed in writing, specifying the reason therefore, within five (5) calendar days of receipt of the decision of the Director of Athletics/Student Activities to the superintendent or his/her designee. The superintendent or his/her designee shall issue a written decision on the appeal within five (5) calendar days after receipt of the written appeal. The decision of the superintendent or his/her designee shall specify the reasons for the decision and shall be final. All penalties will be documented.

#### NOTES:

*It should be understood that during the course of a Code of Conduct violation investigation, school personnel will review all school records and interview staff, students, and local authorities, when applicable. Records may include but are not limited to; school disciplinary records, educational records, activity records, police records, etc.*

**Student Behavior Regulations** suspensions and expulsions override **Code of Conduct** consequences. (i.e. a student on a 10-day suspension will not participate in any school functions, including practices.)

*Students who have not completed **Code of Conduct** suspensions are not in good standing and as such will not be able to participate in awards nights, recognition banquets, or receive letters or other awards.*
