BOARD HONORS "88's BEST":

The Board of Education recognizes students who excel at Addison Trail and Willowbrook High Schools through **88's Best**. They were pleased to honor the following students for their extracurricular accomplishments:



Matthew Turk has demonstrated success in academics and extracurricular activities at **Addison Trail**. Ranking in the top 2% in his senior class, Matt's strong commitment to challenging himself has led him to take a rigorous academic schedule and striving to be as involved as possible.

Matt has earned several honors including Student of the Quarter, Illinois State Scholar, National Honor Society and a four-year member of the honor roll. Matt has also been a four-year baseball and basketball player and named co-captain for both this year. In addition to being an involved in the music program, Matt makes time to give back to the community through service.

Matt has applied to the University of Iowa, the Milwaukee School of Engineering, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology and the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He plans to major in Engineering.

Holly Kosir has excelled in academics and extracurricular activities at **Willowbrook High School**. Holly ranks in the top 4% in her senior class and has taken a wide variety of rigorous courses.

EDUCATIONAL FOCUS ITEMS:

- Mrs. Beth Yacobi, Director of Curriculum and Learning, reported the enrollment data and test scores for Advanced Placement classes from 2002-2008. The district's commitment to providing access to rigorous level courses for all students has contributed to an increase in students taking the AP courses. Furthermore, more students have been taking the exams certified by the College Board and earning scores of 3, 4 and 5 that can be applied at most institutions for college credit.
- Mrs. Yacobi also provided a status report about changes in the Illinois State law and potential implications for the district wide Driver's Education program. Some parents have inquired if Driver's Education could be moved to the freshman year to accommodate the 9-month waiting period before students receive a license. The age requirement remains the same that students must be 15 years old before they receive their permit. All freshman P.E. classes will be surveyed to determine student interest in taking summer Driver's Education for a fee. Based on the results, the district could consider offering instructional sessions and Behind The Wheel for

sophomores and concurrently for freshmen, prioritized by the earliest birthdays. In addition to these next steps, a staff survey would need to be taken to determine the resources available that could support an increased number of drivers.

• Mrs. Jean Barbanente, Director of Learning Services, reported highlights from the DIRECTIONS program, a collaborative effort that began in January 2008 with Glenbard High School District 87 and Downers Grove High School District 99. This alternative learning program is designed to be temporary, so that students can return to their home campuses following one semester to one year of targeted instruction. One of the significant successes has been the implementation of the Positive Behavior and Interventions Support (PBIS) model. The 2009-2010 budget, which represents shared expenses among the districts, was also reviewed.
