Summer Reading Journal Assignment

You will **choose 2 of the 4** journal prompts and create a ~300 word typed response that utilizes textual evidence from the novel with MLA internal citations (Help with MLA Citations can be found through <u>Purdue's Online Writing Lab website</u>:

https://owl.purdue.edu/owl/research and citation/mla style/mla formatting and style guide/mla in text citations the basics.html). The response should demonstrate higher-level thinking and fully answer the prompt.

Choose 2 of the 4 prompts below and title your response with the question.

- 1. Are individuals born "good" or "evil" and are good people capable of bad behavior, and vice versa?
- 2. Is our behavior always the result of choice?
- 3. If you were a character under the circumstances of the story how might you behave?
- 4. Is it always best to sacrifice your own wants and needs for the common good of a community?

Create one Google doc:

- 1. Identify each response with the prompt as its title.
- 2. Times New Roman, size 12 font
- 3. Double-space the document
- 4. Have this saved in your school Google Drive account
- 5. You do not need to print before school starts
- 6. You do not need to submit before school starts
 - a. We will do this together

This will be submitted to your teacher's Google Classroom and turnitin.com with your teachers during class time. Your teacher will help you navigate these platforms.

Use your annotations to help with your journals. You should make margin notes on characters, setting, themes, figurative language & the impact of it (metaphors, similes, symbolism, personification, etc.), questions, unfamiliar vocabulary words (with their definitions!), and other notes that help with your understanding of the text. You will need this book with annotations during the first few weeks of school.

If you have checked the book out from the library, you may use post-it notes and/or write your comments with page numbers on separate pieces of paper. Please ask for an extended due date, as we will use this text during the first four weeks of the school year.
