♦ Educational Focus Items

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) / PERA Update

Mr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, presented information regarding the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). That act was signed into law on December 10 and is the reauthorization of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, and it replaces No Child Left Behind. Several components of ESSA are: it supports the Illinois State Board of Education's efforts to support all students; gives the state autonomy on standards, assessments and interventions; has a stronger focus on homeless students and a focus on subgroup performance; preserves Title grant funding formula; and, at the federal level, it eliminates adequate yearly progress (AYP) and highly qualified status for teachers, which the state will now control.

ESSA requires English, math and science assessments for high school students. As part of the PARCC assessment, District 88 will test students enrolled in ELA 9 and Algebra I. An online science assessment will be administered in April/May for students enrolled in Biology.

No change in the Teacher Evaluation Plan, which is comprised of Professional Practices and Student Growth. District 88 is finishing its first year of full implementation of the Professional Practices and finishing the pilot of the Student Growth component.
