Educational Focus Items for February 22, 2016

The Educational Focus Items for the February 22 Board meeting will include an overview on the Career and Technical Education programs and Project Lead The Way.

SASED Joint Agreement Resolution

Superintendent Dr. Scott Helton shared information related to SASED's Articles of Agreement, which includes the restructuring of its legal status from a Joint Agreement to an Independent Legal Entity, and the transformation of the cooperative's governance structure. Upon ratification, a Governing Board will be established and can only be comprised of "elected" member district Board of Education representatives. The Governing Board will take on the legal responsibilities of final approval of the annual budget and the final approval/hiring of the organization's Executive Director. The Board of Control will continue its function and may consist of either Superintendent or elected Board Member as the district representative. This Resolution will be brought for action before the Board at its next meeting, February 22.

Revised Board Policies

Dr. Helton shared the Board Policies that were reviewed by the Policy Committee. Suggested revisions include modification of language and have been recommended by the Illinois Association of School Boards (IASB) PRESS Publication due to changes in State law and School law. These policies will be brought to the Board for action on February 22.

New Board Policies

Dr. Helton reported on three new policies (6:315, 6:320 and 4:41). Policy 6:315 will allow elementary students to earn credit toward a high school diploma, 6:320 will allow the district to establish and approve a program for granting credit to a student if he or she demonstrates proficiency in the subject area/course and 4:41 discusses the disclosure and transparency related to bonds and securities as recommended by the district's attorneys. These policies will be brought to the Board for action on February 22.

New Administrative Procedures

Dr. Helton shared the Administrative Procedures support Board Policies by defining how to carry out compliance with those policies. These administrative procedures do not require Board action.
