### Recognition of District 88 Successes

Koch Scholarship Recipients

### **Educational Focus Items**

### Behavioral Interventions Committee Recommendations

Assistant Superintendent Mrs. Jean Barbanente presented the recommendations from the 2018 Behavioral Interventions Committee. Minor changes were made to the Student Handbook, in particular to Section 2-Attendance; Section 6-Discipline and Conduct; Section 7-Internet, Technology and Publications; and Section 8-Search and Seizure. These recommendations do not reflect significant changes in practices or legal requirements. There were no recommendations to Policy 7:180-Prevention of and Response to Bullying, Intimidation and Harassment nor to Section 9-Athletic and Extracurricular Activities of the Student Handbook.

Mrs. Barbanente, along with the principals, gave an update on the district's PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) program. In 2007, the district changed its protocol on behavior interventions to a more proactive approach in terms of communicating, teaching and reteaching its expectations. This has been established through the Blazer Pride and Warrior Code Programs. Students are acknowledged weekly for their positive behavior and receive a token.

Mrs. Barbanente reviewed Senate Bill 100, which pertains to out-of-school suspensions and the interventions the district implemented. Historical data shows a down trend in suspensions/behavior.

### New Textbooks, Classroom Sets & Supplementary Instructional Materials

Mrs. Barbanente and Dr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment, shared the district will use federal Title I funds to buy classroom sets of textbook and supplemental instructional materials to minimize the out-of-pocket cost to families. Last year, this investment reduced the average textbook sale amount from \$165 per paying student to \$103 this year.

Dr. Cibulka reported the district's focus for the upcoming school year will be to reduce costs associated with courses taken by freshmen, especially with the addition of all freshmen receiving a Chromebook.
