♦ School-Wide Assessment Program 2016-17

Mr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, gave an overview of the state's transition to the SAT college entrance exam. That exam includes three sections: reading, writing and language, and math. The SAT scoring will range from 400-1600. The PSAT/SAT assessment results will allow for test analysis, tracking of student growth and will assist in identifying students who should access Advanced Placement courses and interventions. Students will have access to individualized practice assessments through Khan Academy and will be entered into a scholarship pool beyond National Merit Scholarship. Cibulka shared District 88's plan to implement the PSAT/SAT.
