The resolution will direct the County Clerk to partially abate the Debt Service levy to lower the overall 2009 tax rate to ensure it does not go beyond the pledge of 1.4795. The pledge objective of maintaining a level overall tax rate for five (5) years was established during the April 2007 referendum campaign.
