Bus Transportation Service Agreement

Mr. Hoster reported the current student transportation service with Cottage Hill Operating Company is in the final year of a two-year extension agreement as of June 2016. The law allowed for a two-year extension and thereafter, an annual renewal, unless a request to bid is received. According to a recent area survey, the district has a competitive rate. Cottage Hill has consistently provided the most competitive pricing to operate our fleet of buses and has been a long-time valued partner. The Board authorized the administration to begin negotiations for the 2016-17 term.

2016-17 School Calendar

Dr. Scott Helton, Superintendent of Schools, presented a draft of the 2016-17 School Calendar. Some highlights of next year's calendar include: October 5 and 6 will be early dismissal days, followed by Parent-Teacher Conferences in the evening; 1st-semester finals will be administered before winter break; 2nd semester will begin on Monday, January 9; Casimir Pulaski Day (March 6) will be an attendance day; 2nd-semester finals will be administered before Memorial Day, if no Emergency Days are used.
