Board Honors Koch Scholarship and Lopatka Art Scholarship Recipients


Since the spring of 1984, the **David Koch Board of Education Scholarship** has been given in honor of former District 88 Superintendent (1974-1983) Dr. David Koch. The \$1,500 scholarship is awarded annually to a student from Addison Trail and Willowbrook. The 2011 recipients are:

Student Exchange Program to Addison Sister City Triggiano, Italy

Addison Trail Faculty sponsors Courtney DeMent, Laura Calo and Enza DeFranco, shared their experiences about the recent student exchange program to Addison Sister City Triggiano, Italy. Village of Addison Mayor Larry Hartwig presented information about this unique partnership with the high school. Additionally, several Sister City Committee members were recognized for their contributions to the twelve Addison Trail students who participated in the trip, which occurred during spring break in March 2011. Mayor Hartwig also spoke about plans for future Sister City projects, including a return trip to Triggiano.

INFORMATION ITEMS:

- The **Board of Education Committee Assignments**, effective July 1, 2011 for one-year, were presented.
- Dr. Humphrey reported on recent legislative initiatives known as the Performance Evaluation Reform Act (PERA) that will impact several areas of education in the areas of personnel. The legislation, passed by the general assembly, still requires the signature of the Governor.
- Mr. Matt Thompson, Addison Trail Athletic Director, presented information on current district concussion protocals as well as new protocols that are emerging from the experts and other school districts. This information will continue to be reviewed over the summer, with implementation and training to occur in the fall.
- Mrs. Jean Barbanente, Assistant Superintendent, reported highlights from the recent Curriculum Council meeting. Because curriculum review and monitoring is ongoing district-wide, the council has determined future meetings will only be convened when policy decisions need to be made. At this time, the council does not recommend modifying the graduation requirements. The core departments will be compiling a comprehensive online curriculum guide as part of the school improvement process. The focus is on aligning curriculum with the common core standards and preparing students with the skills to be ready for post-secondary opportunities.
