◇ **Educational Focus Items**

New Course Proposals and Program Changes for 2017-18

Assistant Superintendent Mrs. Jean Barbanente and Director of Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment Mr. Adam Cibulka provided an overview of recommended program changes and new course proposals for the 2017-18 school year. The proposed courses are: Project Lead The Way Environmental Sustainability at Addison Trail; Advanced Computer Repair-CTE (I&T) and Project Lead The Way Biomedical Science at Willowbrook. No changes have been made to the graduation requirement, but the administration is proposing adjustments to course sequencing to align with college readiness. Beginning with the Class of 2020, students will be required to take three consecutive years of social studies, starting with Human Geography or AP Human Geography in grade 9 and continuing in grades 10 and 11.

School Report Card

Mr. Cibulka presented highlights of the School Report Card, which was released on October 31, 2016. The 2015-16 results show both schools improved tremendously on the PARCC exam, with the biggest percentage point increases in DuPage County of students not only meeting or exceeding, but also approaching expectations.

In 2014-15, the district's composite was 44 percent of its students approached, met or exceeded expectations; and in 2015-16, the number has increased to 62 percent. The district's ELA was 50 percent compared to 71 percent in 2015-16, and the district's Math was 37 percent in 2014-15 compared to 54 percent in 2015-16. Our graduation rate and Freshmen on Track are also above the state level.
