District 88 School Safety Forum

Superintendent Dr. Scott Helton recognized both principals for their leadership with this event. In early March, our students spoke with the principals about a forum to provide an opportunity for them to share their voices about national, state and local issues on school safety. With the help of Peg Agnos from LEND and DuPage Regional Superintendent Dr. Darlene Ruscitti, representatives, local leaders and first responders met with students from 28 Chicago-area high schools for a day of conversation and planning regarding school safety. The student leaders left with an action plan to take back to their schools. A video clip from the March 12 event at Willowbrook was played, and the bullseye web maps the student leaders created were shown.

Principal of Willowbrook Dr. Daniel Krause shared the best thing of the day was seeing the students come together around some common themes. One particular theme was creating inclusive/supportive environments for all students.

Principal of Addison Trail Mr. Michael Bolden shared the students realized they have a voice, and the students will continue to meet and discuss what they would like to communicate and how to move forward.

Educational Focus Item

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Program/Course Updates and Staffing Projections

Dr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, gave an overview of the new courses for the 2018-19 school year. He further shared discussions continue with Elmhurst College related to asynchronous programs and the expansion of the program in District 88. Benedictine University has shown an interest in working with the district about its options.

Mrs. Jean Barbanente, Assistant Superintendent, discussed the rationale for courses that might not run in a particular year. The district prioritizes areas that provide credentialing for students such as Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, Capstones within an elective area and courses that would be part of a required sequence. High priority is also given to the areas of intervention, special education and ESL per the state and/or federal capsize enrollment requirement. These areas are taken into consideration as the district discusses staffing priorities for the 2018-19 school year.

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Mrs. Barbanente shared the staffing process, which is dependent on course enrollment and allocation for the 2018-19 school year. The district is experiencing an expansion in several self-contained special education programs due to class size limits.

Public Hearing on Proposed Honorable Dismissal of Teachers Due to Economic Necessity (Reduction In Force)

A public hearing took place on the proposed honorable dismissal of teachers due to economic necessity (reduction in force).

In accordance with Senate Bill 7, Public Act 97-0008, Dr. Scott Helton shared the School Board must hold a public hearing on the question of teacher dismissals. After the hearing, any action to approve a reduction in force must be a majority vote by the Board of Education. The administration recommends the following resolutions for Board approval: 10-J. Resolution Authorizing Honorable Dismissal of Teachers (for 6 staff); 10-K. Resolution Authorizing Honorable Dismissal and Reassignment of Teacher (for 1 staff); and 10-L. Resolution Authorizing Notice and Honorable Dismissal of Certain Educational Support Personnel (for 15 staff).

Mrs. Barbanente shared the Performance Evaluation Review Act (PERA) requirements. The Sequence of Honorable Dismissal List categorizes teachers by their summative ratings and drives the groupings.

Credit Card Summary

Mr. Edward Hoster, Chief Financial Officer, reviewed the district's credit card use report for February 2018, as outlined in Board Policy 4:55 Use of Credit and Procurement Cards.

Transportation Contract Extension for 2018-19 - Regular & Special Education

Mr. Hoster shared the district is negotiating an extension of the contract for regular and special education transportation services with Cottage Hill Operating Company. Cottage Hill's proposal reflects a route rate increase of 2.1% (aligns with the consumer price index that also drives the district's primary funding for 2018-19), maintenance expense cap for the district's fleet of buses, and a separate hourly rate for out-of-state/special licensing charters.

The existing performance-based contract addendum would remain. Overall, there are areas in which services have improved, however staffing is still an issue.
