Educational Focus Items for October 31, 2016

Credit Card Summary

Chief Financial Officer Mr. Edward Hoster reviewed the district's credit card use report for September 2016, as outlined in Board Policy 4:55 Use of Credit and Procurement Cards.

Evidence-Based Funding Model

Superintendent Dr. Scott Helton shared the evidence-based funding model, which identifies how much money is needed per pupil to educate students in Illinois. Its intent is to provide a level of fiscal resources to enable all students to perform at high levels. A video prepared by the Vision 20/20 Group (IASA/IASBO/IASB/IPA/SCSDD/IARSS) also was shared.

Dr. Helton also stressed that this model will work best if the state adds new revenue to support districts that need more resources. He further stated that the model should maintain a hold harmless policy per other districts and not take funds away from any district in the state.

Seal of Biliteracy Update

Mrs. Barbanente and Director of Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment Mr. Adam Cibulka provided an overview of the Seal of Biliteracy and District 88's implementation process. This year's focus will be students proficient in English and Spanish, and the district looks to expand to other languages in the near future.

1:1 Pilot Update

Director of Technology, Teaching & Learning Dr. Aaron Lenaghan reported the technology coaches are implementing the 1:1 pilot this fall with their students. These coaches will gather data on the use of the devices in and out of school, any barriers to access online curricular resources, and what instructional resources staff would need for a 1:1 environment.

Technology Staff Development

Dr. Lenaghan shared several training sessions specific to staff development with technology have taken place for teachers, classified and clerical staff as it applies to their job function. These types of training sessions will continue throughout the year.
