SEPARATE ACTION ITEM that was approved by the Board:

Recommendation to accept a monetary donation from Susan Mika, director of the Good Heart Work Smart Foundation to establish a giving tree fund for underserved Willowbrook students; a monetary donation from Jerry Granger and Carol Overly, Co-managers of the Villa Park Wal-Mart store #1737 to be used for the Transition program; and a donation of a 30 computers from Mr. Keith Zeitz, manager of Office and Classroom Technology at College of DuPage, to replace and supplement existing machines for use in WB computer repair classes.

INFORMATION ITEMS:

- Effective immediately, **Public Act 95-0990** changes the threshold that triggers the lowest responsible bid requirement from \$10,000 to \$25,000. The current District 88 Board policy requires Board approval for bidding and purchases of expenditures in excess of \$10,000. Although the Board has the option of changing this policy due to recent legislation, the consensus is to not make any adjustments of the threshold level at this time.
- Educational Focus Items including recognition of 88's Best for Academics as well as School Improvement reports from the Assistant Principals of Curriculum & Instruction were previewed for October 27, 2008.
