School Report Card / ESSA Monitoring Instrument

Dr. Adam Cibulka, Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, presented an overview of the preliminary data that will be reflected in the upcoming School Report Card The final results will be released at the end of October. He shared the District's 4-year Graduation Rate increased about one percent from the prior year and the Dropout Rate decreased by 0.4 percent. For the SAT Performance, the District's average in the Evidence-based Reading and Writing section is above the college readiness benchmark score and the mathematics section is approaching the benchmark score. The Freshmen On-Track Rate is up 2.6 percent from the prior year. Dr. Cibulka also shared that nearly 950 3's, 4's and 5's were earned on Advanced Placement exams and more than 2300 credit hours were earned through the dual credit courses. The results of the 5Essential Survey showed that more than 90 percent of the students responded that teachers work hard to make sure that all students are learning, all students are encouraged to go to college and high school is seen as a preparation for the future.

Superintendent Dr. Scott Helton and Dr. Cibulka provided an overview of the ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act) plan indicators and a demonstration on how the district is using 5Lab, an analytic software, to monitor student progress.
