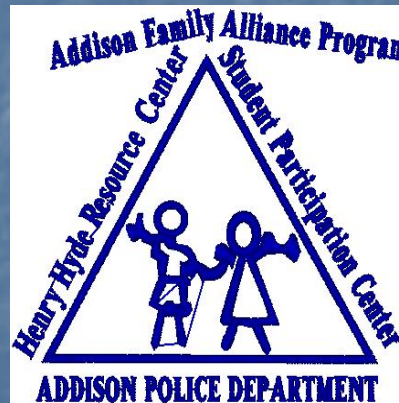

# Purpose of Center

- Highest "calls for service" when Michael Lane NRC was opened
- Dispel belief that the Police Department is not accessible
- Build Trust between the Police Department, the Village and the community
- To provide needed services to the community



# Mission Statement

# Staffing at the HHRC

- In September of 2007
  - Director – Full Time ~ Paid through the Village of Addison
  - Part-time Site Coordinator (70%) ~ Paid through grant funding
  - Teen Mentors ~Paid through a grant (DuPage County)
  - Volunteers
- In February of 2016
  - Director – Full Time – Paid through the Village of Addison
  - Senior Site Coordinator – Full Time – Paid through the Village of Addison
  - Part-time Assistant Coordinator (50%) – Paid through CDBG funding
  - Part-time Evening & Weekend Coordinator (50%) – Paid through the Village of Addison
  - Volunteers

# Staff Projected Needs

- Director ~ Full Time
- Senior Site Coordinator ~ Full Time
- 2 Assistant Coordinators (50%) ~ Part-time
- Evening & Weekend Coordinator (50%) ~ Part-time
- Teen Mentors – Seasonal
- Volunteers



# Police Contribution

- 2 Crime Prevention Officers assigned to After School Programming
  - An Officer is assigned to the Center 3 hours a week
- Children and Families interacting with Police Officers now the norm at the Center
- Community members are reporting more crimes and assisting in cleaning up their neighborhood



# Village/Police/Neighborhood Relationship Development

- Number of Calls for Services have DECREASED
- Officer involvement & programming has increased. Residents interact with police regularly
- Police/Village Services being offered on site
  - Village Stickers, Car Seat Checks, Bicycle Registrations, ID Kits for Kids
- Integrating the Neighborhood into the Emergency Operation Plan - Transportation Site
- CERT in Spanish – already certified over 40 Spanish speaking residents
- Fire Department offered 3 CPR classes in Spanish in 2015



# Impact on Community

## ■ Crime Statistics

- 200% decrease in Murders
- 22% decrease in Battery Assault
- 12% decrease in Criminal Damage to Property
- 45% decrease in Unlawful Use of Weapons
- 10% decrease in Sex Offenses
- 5% decrease in Disorderly Conduct
- 45% decrease in Fights
- 9% decrease in Other Trouble Calls

# Impact on Community continued...

- Increase in reporting of crimes  
(Demonstrates more comfort and openness with PD)
  - Domestic Battery – 132% increase
  - Gang Contact – 31% increase
  - Suspicious Incidents – 60% increase
  - Domestic Issues – 16% increase



# FUNDING AT HHRC

- Operating Budget from Village of Addison
- Grants
  - Community Development Block Grant ~ U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development
    - Pays for Part-time Assistant Coordinator (current)
    - Only existing grant
- Fundraising / Private Donations
  - Community and Business Donations
  - Mayor's Ball

## Addison Parks and Rec 'C.H.A.M.P.s' graduate at the Henry Hyde Center

**ADDISON** — The Addison Park and Recreation Foundation, through a community grant of \$500 and in partnership with the Henry Hyde Resource Center in Addison, recently graduated 10 students through the C.H.A.M.P. Within after-school program.

The C.H.A.M.P. Within after school program is a six-week empowerment educational program that provides lessons and activities in the areas of Character, Happiness, Attitude, Mentality, and Purpose (CHAMP). The program is delivered under the guidance of a trained facilitator and uses The C.H.A.M.P. Within textbook and workbook exercises to strengthen awareness of these traits in the students.
