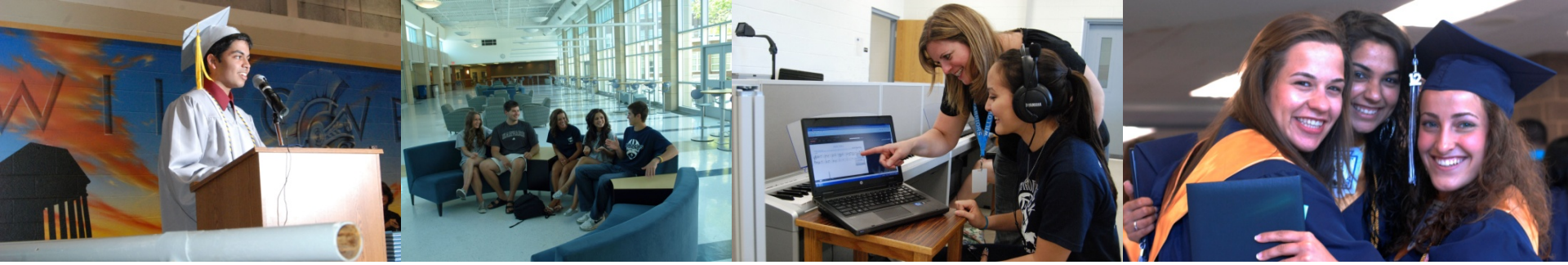

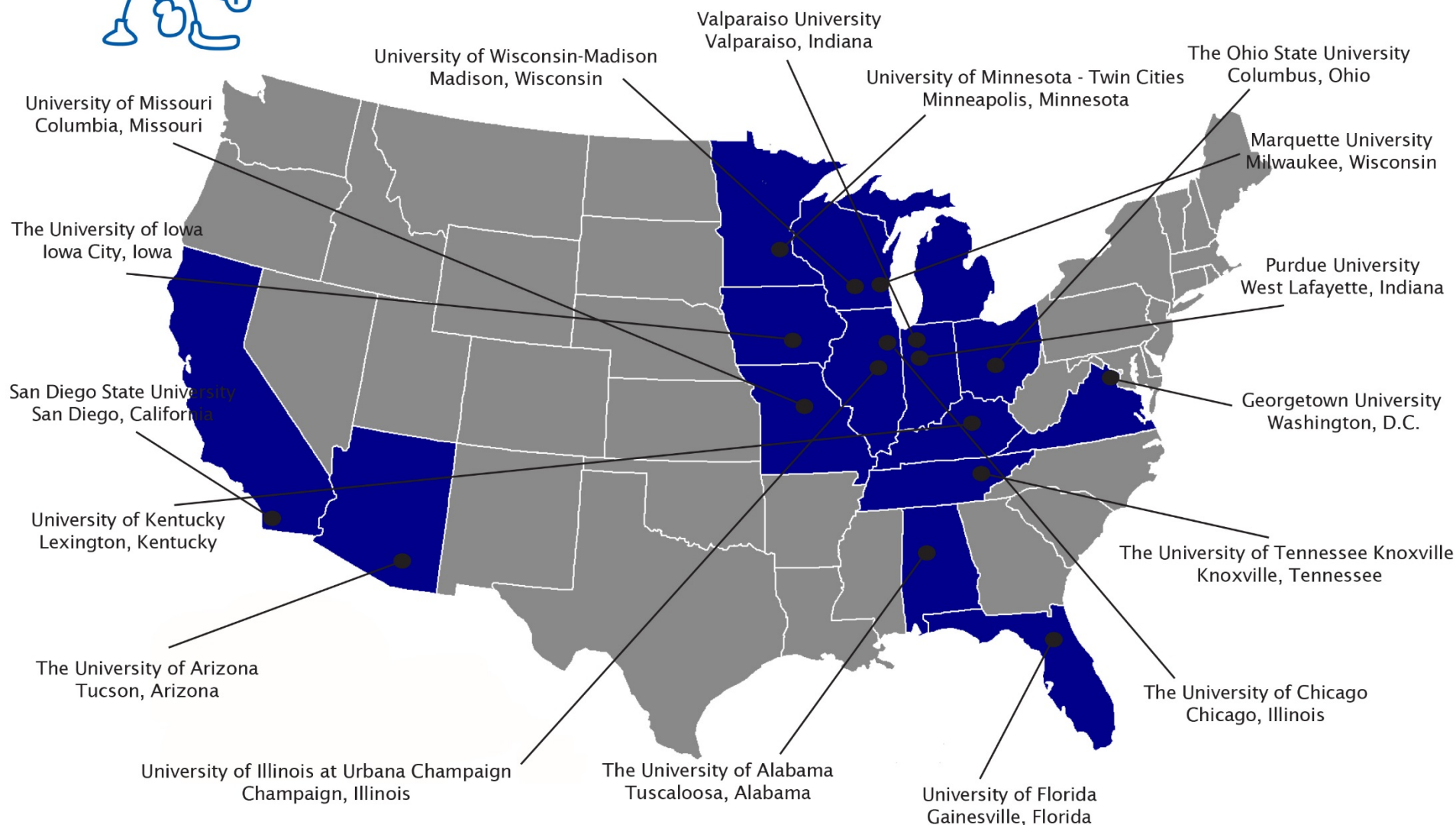

Addison Trail graduates are attending colleges from coast to coast

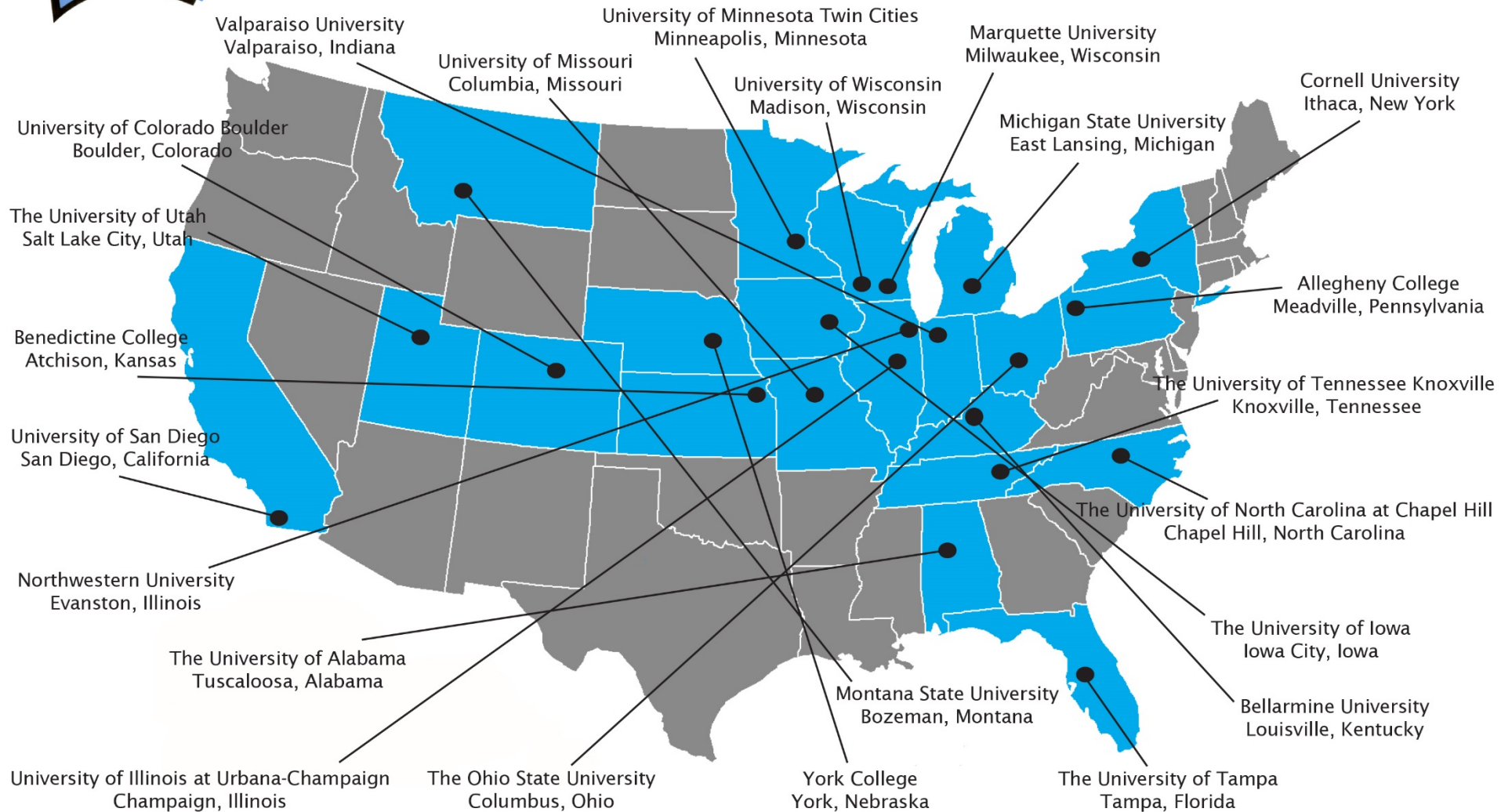

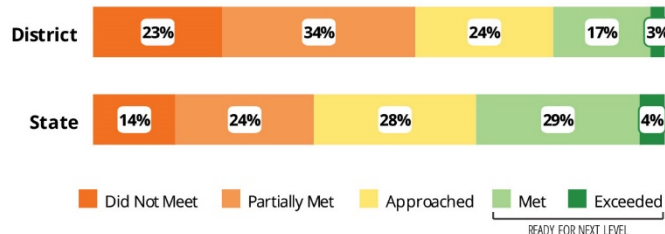

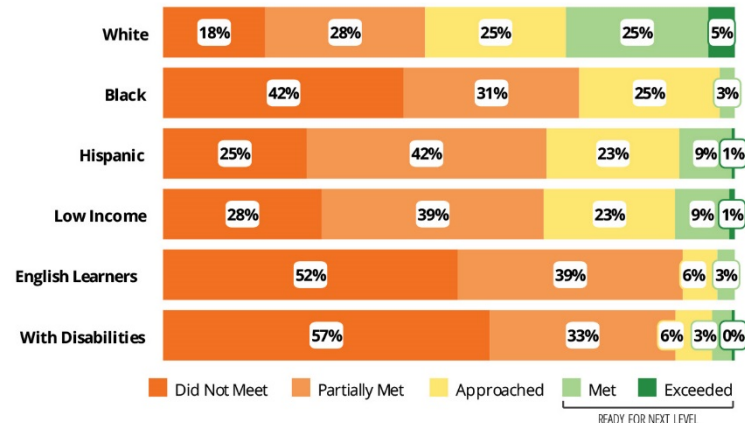
Academic Success

Students who meet or exceed ACT college readiness benchmarks



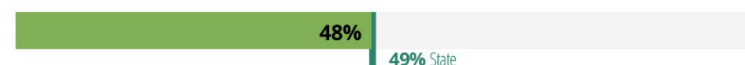
Postsecondary Enrollment

Students who enroll at colleges and universities

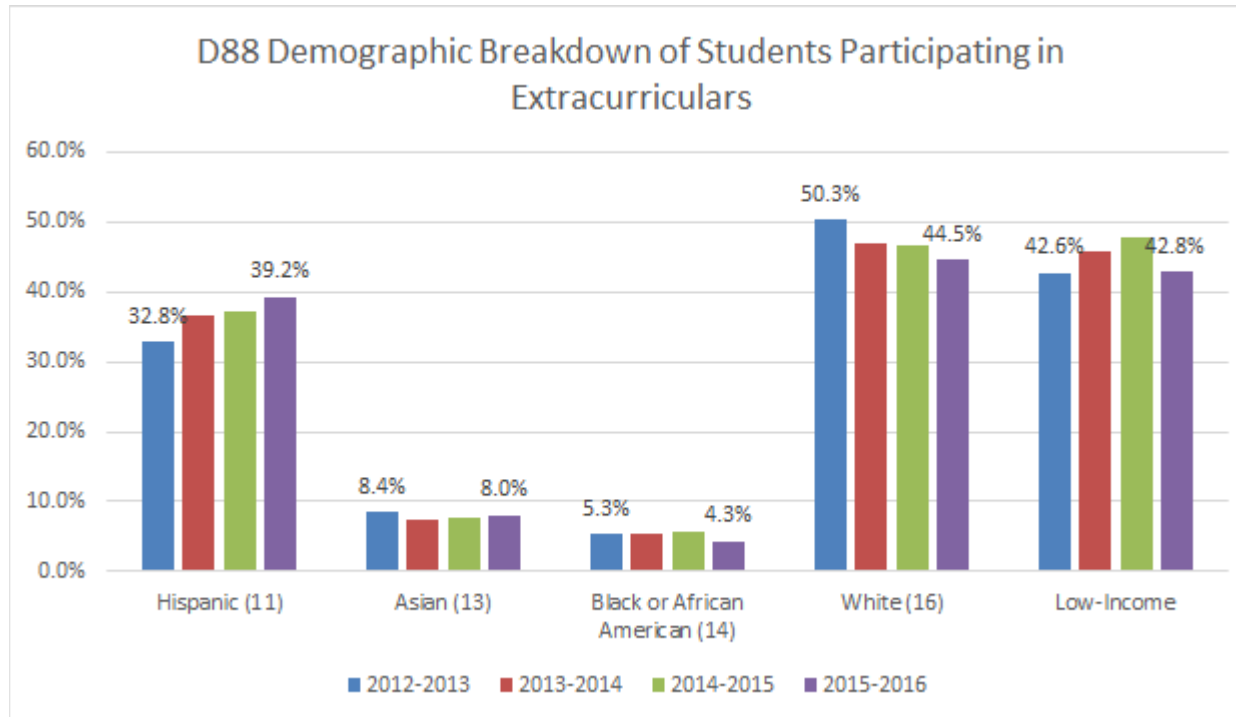


Postsecondary Remediation (lower is better)

Students enrolled in Illinois community colleges who require remedial coursework

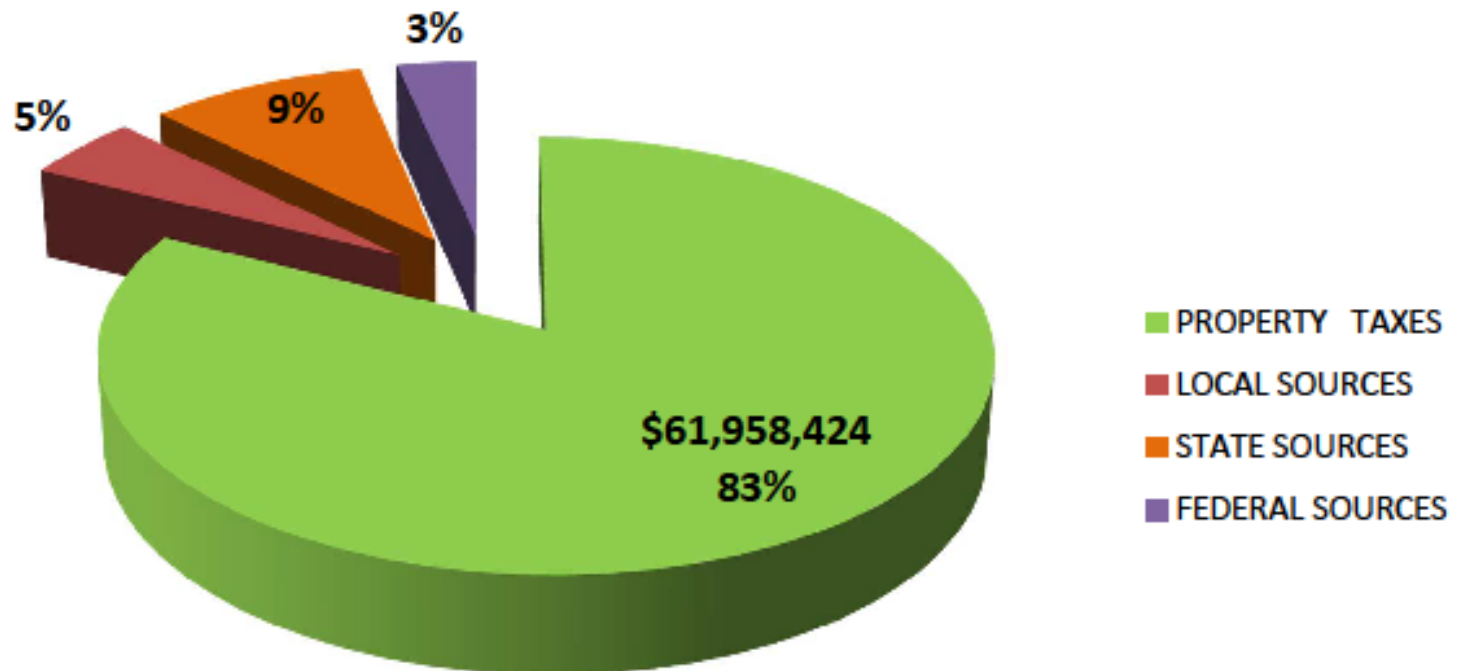

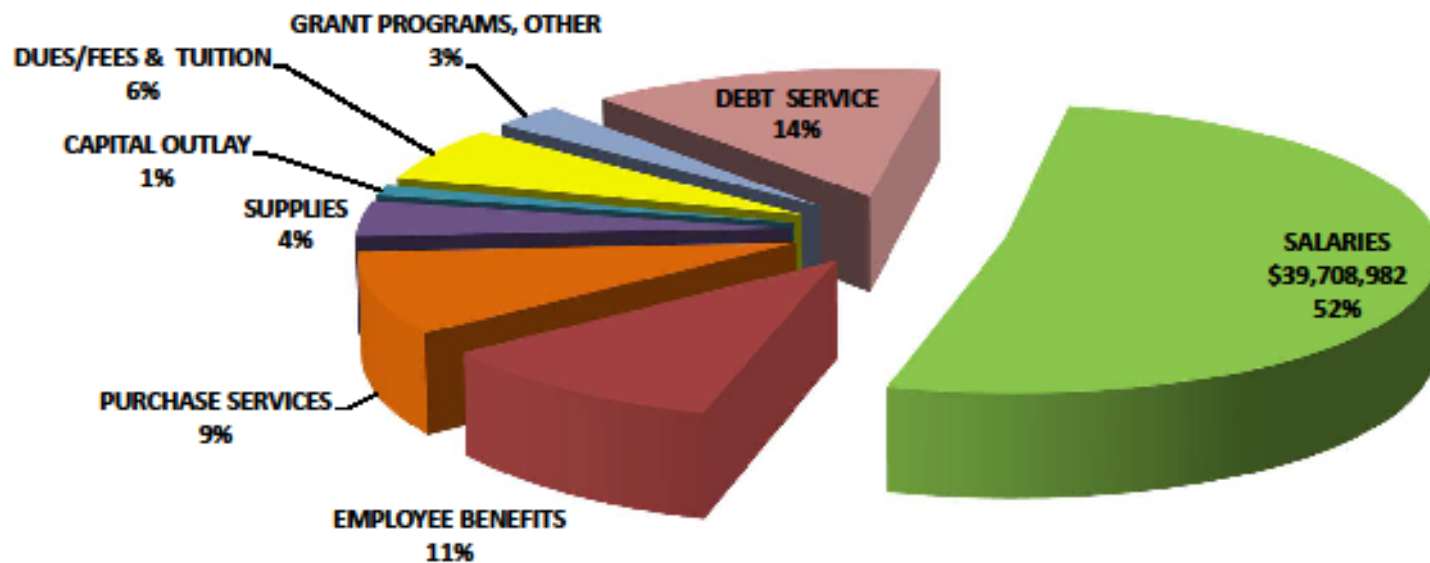
TOTAL REVENUE BUDGET BY TYPE (SOURCE) 2015-16

Working together – secret to success



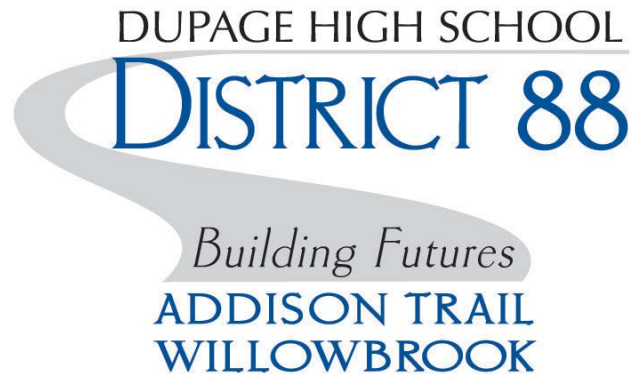
We also work closely with our local villages, officials and legislators.

What it means to be a Board member



Role of a Board member

- Understands the first and greatest concern must be the educational welfare of all students attending the public schools.
- Understands the Board sets the standards for the district through Board policy.
- Board members do not manage the district on a day-to-day basis. Board members determine the “what.” Administration determines the “how” and “who.”
- Understands the Board makes decisions as a team. Individual Board members may not commit the Board to any action.



Goals of a Board member

- The development of educational programs that meet the individual needs of every student, regardless of ability, race, sex, creed, social standing or disability
- The development of procedures for the regular and systematic evaluation of programs, staff performance and Board operations to ensure progress toward educational and fiscal goals
- The development of effective Board policies, which provide direction for the operation of the schools and delegate authority to the Superintendent for their implementation
- The development of systematic communications that ensure the Board, administration, staff, students and community are fully informed and the staff understands the community's aspirations for its schools

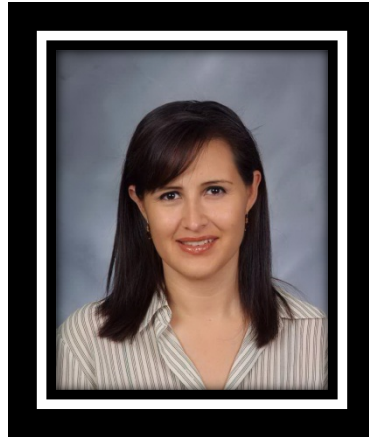

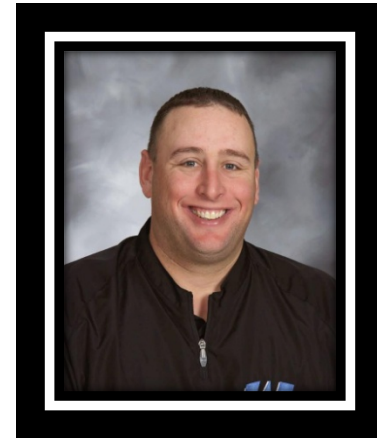

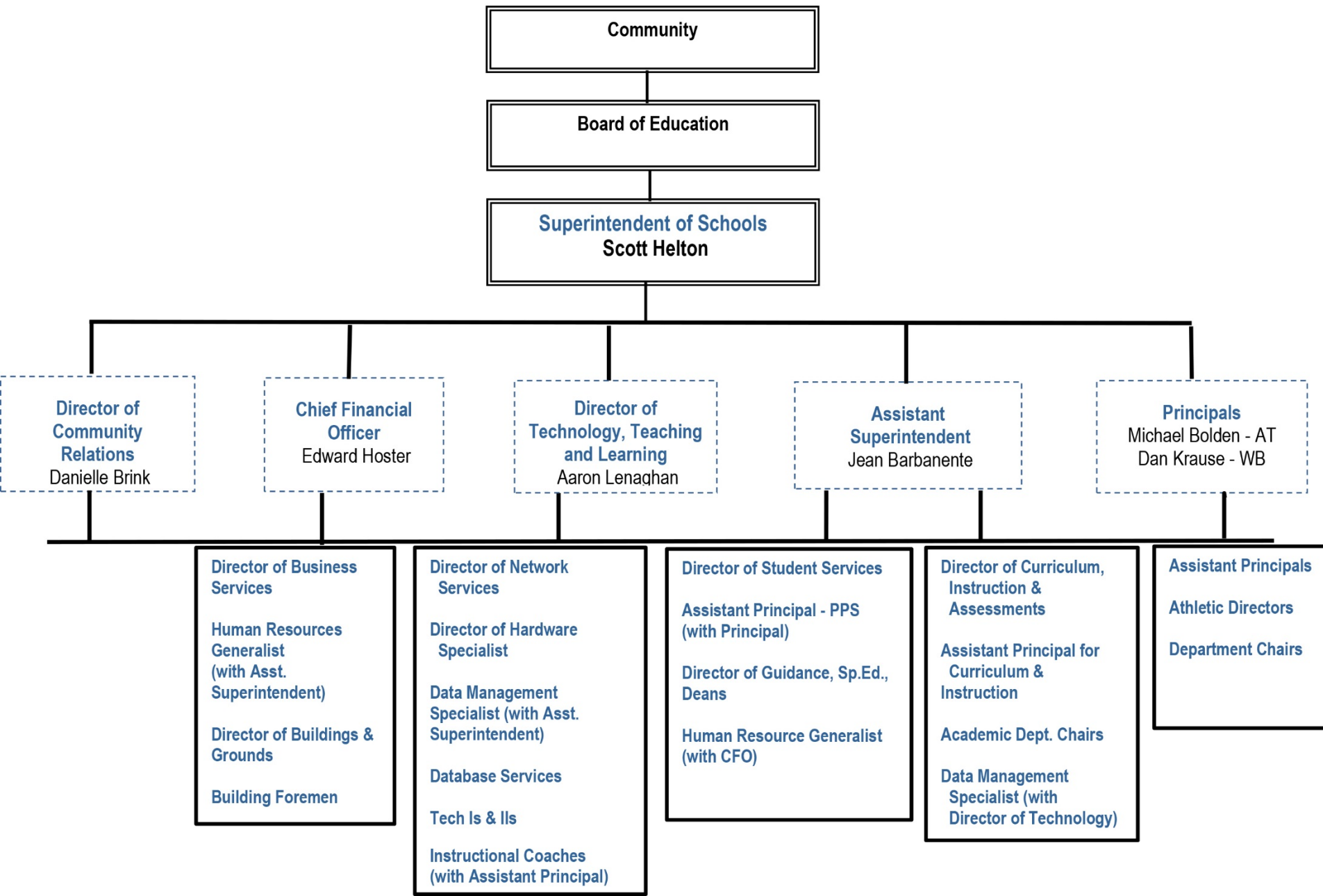
