

- Department heads reviewed the school safety procedures District 88 implemented last school year. District 88 implemented ALICE Training (which stands for Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) to continue to enhance the security and well-being of students and staff.
 - Department heads received training on the district's new rapid emergency response system as well. The district worked with the Addison Police Department and Addison School District 4 and received a grant from the Department of Justice for the School Violence Prevention Program. With the funding from this grant, District 88 and District 4 bought and recently installed a rapid emergency response system in all school facilities through BluePoint Alert Solutions. This system includes pull stations similar to fire alarms, strobe lights and mobile panic buttons that will be placed throughout the schools and outside the buildings. Students will receive training at a later date.
