Warriors reel off five straight victories

SINDERITY REDIEDS COURS BUILD OF LIGHTS OF FERENCE STOLLE

Strong pitching and potent hitting push team to winning record

The Willowbrook softball team extended its winning streak to five games with Saturday's 5-2 home victory over Oak Park/River Forest. The win over the Huskies gave the War-

riors an overall season record of 6-4.
Willowbrook's winning streak
began with an 11-2 victory at Hinsdale Central on May 8. The Warriors began last week's action with a 9-4 West Suburban Gold Conference win at Morton on May 10. Two days later. Willowbrook earned an 8-1 confer-ence win over Leyden in Villa Park. The Warriors pushed their winning streak to four games with Friday's 7-1

conference victory at Addison Trail.
"This is kind of the season I imagined for us," said Willowbrook coach Rachel Karos after Saturday's crossover win over Oak Park/River Forest of the West Suburban Silver Conference. "This is the type of stuff I knew we could do. We're stringing it together and believing that we can do it. Our pitchers are throwing with more confidence, and they're trusting our defense,

Senior Caroline Dooley pitched a complete game for the Warriors on Saturday and earned her fourth victory of the season.



Junior Caitlyn Kulczyski ignited Willowbrook's offense in Saturday's game by hitting a home run to lead off the bottom of the first inning. Senior Annemarie Knudtson and Dooley both singled later in the inning. Moments later, sophomore Kayleigh Dennison lashed a two-out, two-run double to give the Warriors a 3-0 first-iuning lead. Willowbrook's lead stood at 3-2 in

the bottom of the fifth inning when ju-nior Grace Hayes stepped to the plate. Hayes launched a two-run home run over the left-field fence to push the Warriors' lead to 5-2. Dooley reached base on a single just before Hayes connected for the home run.

Kulczyski fired a complete game for Willowbrook in Friday's win at Addison Trail. She piled up 14 strike-outs and allowed two hits, two walks and no earned runs.

Willowbrook won two of three games in last week's conference series against Hinsdale South. The Warriors defeated the Homets 9-6 on May 10 in Villa Park. Three days later, Willow-brook earned a 7-2 victory at Hinsdale

The Hornets won the final game of the series, beating Willowbrook 11-9 on Saturday in Villa Park.

In addition to playing three games against Hinsdale South last week, the against Hinsdate South last week, the Warriors played a crossover game against Lyons Township of the West Suburban Silver Conference on May 12. Playing on its home field, Willow-brook beat the Lions 8-5.

"We had a 14-day COVID break,"

stated Willowbrook head coach Vic. Wisner after the victory over Lyons' Township. Many of the team's players reportedly had to quarantine for several days after having some contact with a student who tested positive for the coronavirus. Wisner said that seven of Willowbrook's players were able to

practice during the break.

"It's taken us awhile to figure out who we are," Wisner added after last week's win over the Lions. "But I think we know our identity now. We play hard. We run the bases hard, and we put pressure on you all the time. We're a team that battles. We're right on the edge of being really, really good,"
