Villa Park Brewfest to be held this Saturday

The Villa Park Brewfest will take place this Saturday, Oct. 2, from 2 to 5:30 p.m. at Cortesi Veterans Memorial Park. The park is located at 318 E. Kenilworth Ave.

A celebration of craft beer, the Villa Park Brewfest will offer more than 80 different styles of craft beer and hard ciders.

The Villa Park Brewfest is for adults age 21 and older. No one under the age of 21 will be allowed entrance, including designated drivers. All children are strictly prohibited from attending.

While the event will run from 2 to 5:30 p.m. for general admission ticket holders, Gold Pass holders will be able to enter at 1 p.m. In addition to early admission, Gold Pass ticket

holders receive 24 drink tickets, private restroom access, special samples of VIP beers and a commemorative tasting glass.

General admission ticket holders receive 18 drink tickets and a commemorative tasting glass.

Gold Pass tickets are \$65 per person. General admission tickets are \$47 per person if purchased before the event, and \$55 per person if purchased on Saturday.

A designated driver ticket costs \$15 and includes complimentary soda and bottled water. Designated drivers are prohibited from sampling beer and hard cider.

Be cautious when purchasing used vehicles, says White

Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White is warning consumers interested in purchasing used vehicles to beware of flood-damaged cars resulting from flooding caused by Hurricane Ida or other natural disasters.

"We are taking steps to ensure that flood-damaged vehicles from hurricanes do not receive clean titles in Illinois," White said. "While my office will do everything it can to protect Illinoisans, it is always important that consumers also take active steps to protect themselves from purchasing damaged vehicles."

In an effort to protect Illinois consumers, White has instructed his office to closely monitor title applica-

tions involving potential flood vehicles. This includes ensuring vehicles coming from counties impacted by flooding are properly identified and labeled as flood vehicles when applicable.

White urged consumers to gather as much information as possible about a vehicle before making a purchase. Consumers are encouraged to obtain a National Motor Vehicle Title Information System (NMVTIS) vehicle history report by visiting <https://vehiclehistory.bja.ojp.gov/>.

In addition, White said that CARFAX is providing a link to check for flood vehicles. To visit the free link, go to www.carfax.com/flood.

Attempt to set a new record falls short

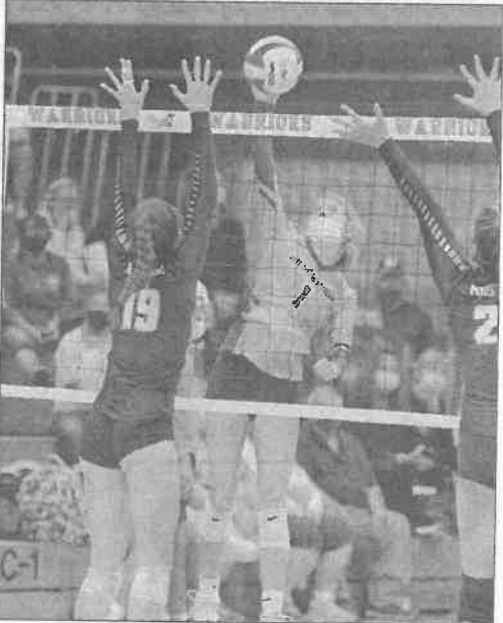
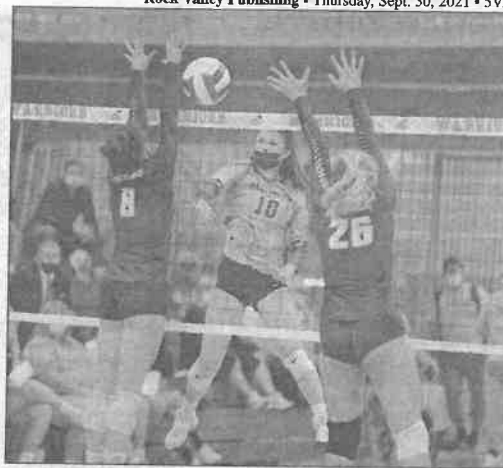
Saturday's Paws and Claws in the Park animal adoption event at Villa Park's Lions Park included an attempt to set a new mark in Guinness World Records history. The Villa Park Community F.U.N. (Focus on Unifying Neighbors) Commission organized the effort to try to hold the world's largest dog wedding ceremony at Saturday's event. Claire Elise Stephens, a Guinness World Records adjudicator, traveled from New York to observe the attempt. Stephens

is pictured (bottom left) while she announced if the Villa Park ceremony had set a new record. A 2007 event in Colorado that included 178 pairs of dogs established the record for the largest dog wedding ceremony. Saturday's attempt in Villa Park, which featured 80 pairs of dogs, fell short of setting a new record. The participants included (above, left to right) Cris Poggi of Villa Park and her daughter—Valentina Poggi. Valentina is a Willowbrook High School graduate. She graduated from Elmhurst University earlier this year, and is now attending the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign, where she is studying veterinary medicine. The Poggis are pictured with (left to right) Blue and Stella. Another photo (left) from Saturday shows Villa Park Village President Nick Cuzzone, who dressed in a tuxedo to preside over the light-hearted wedding ceremony. Warriors beat the Eagles

The Willowbrook football team improved to 3-2 overall and 3-0 in West Suburban Gold Conference play following Friday's 36-7 victory at Leyden. The Warriors, who began the season with non-conference road losses at Providence Catholic and Downers Grove North, have since won three consecutive conference contests. Junior Joey Tumilty (No. 10) scored three touchdowns for the Warriors in Friday's victory against Leyden, which dropped to 1-4 overall and 0-3 in the conference. Senior Evan Stubblefield scored one touchdown for Willowbrook, which held a 14-7 halftime lead. Junior Amar! Buchanan provided a defensive score for the Warriors when he intercepted a Leyden pass and returned it for a touchdown. Willowbrook will play its homecoming game this Friday against its District 88 rival—Addison Trail. The Blazers will enter the game at 0-5 overall and 0-2 in the West Suburban Gold Conference.

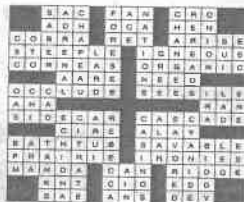
