1974 Football Team

In the first year of the IHSA State playoffs, the Warriors, led by Hall of Fame Coach Clint Evans, finished the season with a 10-2 record and made it to the IHSA Semifinals. The Warriors were the DPVL Champions, earned ten individual All-Conference honors, and Captain Tom Domin was named as All-State and All-American. The Warriors were ranked #1 in the state after their victory over East Leyden (23-6). Willowbrook had playoff victories against Niles West (21-3) in the preliminary round and St. Viator (22-6) in the Quarterfinals. The Warriors lost to the eventual State Champions Glenbrook North in the IHSA Semi Finals. The 1974 Football Program currently has five members in the Willowbrook Athletic Hall of Fame (Evans, Loew, Wilkin, Domin, Kelsay)

Charles Froeming

Class of 1965

Charles was a three-sport athlete while attending Willowbrook: Boys Gymnastics, Football, and Boys Track and Field. His foundation in Gymnastics led him to a lifelong career in the sport. As a Warrior, Charles earned: four varsity letters, two-time All-Conference selection, two-time All-District selection, and two-time All-State selection. Additionally, Froeming was a member of the undefeated 1964 Hall of Fame State Champion Boys Gymnastics team. After High School, Charles continued his career at the University of Michigan where he earned two varsity letters and was a member of Big Ten Championships Teams in 1968 and in 1969. Charles earned Big Ten All-Conference honors by placing third on the Still Rings in 1969 and NCAA All-American honors by placing fourth at the NCAA Division I National Championships in 1969. Following his athletic career, Charles continued to give back to the sport. He coached at Addison Trail from 1969 to 1973, founded the IGN Iowa Gym-nest private club with Hall of Fame teammate Neil Schmitt, and he participated in managing the gymnastic equipment for the 1984 Olympics.

Molly Krawczykowski

Class of 2014

During her time at Willowbrook, Molly was a member of the Girls Cross Country, Girls Basketball, and Girls Track and Field Teams. Molly earned a total of eleven varsity letters, was a captain, MVP, seven-time West Suburban All-Conference, West Suburban Academic All-Conference, All-Area, Academic All-State, IHSA State Qualifier, and an IHSA All-State athlete. In 2013 Molly earned All-State in the IHSA State Championships for the 800 Meter Run. Molly also helped lead the Girls Basketball team to the West Suburban Conference Title. In 2014, she was voted as the Helen Carpenter Award winner as the Most Valuable Female Athlete. Molly continued her career at Illinois State University where she earned four varsity letters in Cross Country and three varsity letters in Track and Field. While there she helped her team win multiple Conference Championships and she was recognized as a two-time All-Missouri Valley award winner.

Mohamed Awad

Class of 1976

During his time as a Willowbrook Warrior, Mohamed was a member and leader of the Boys Soccer Team. While on the soccer team Mohamed earned three varsity letters, was a 3-time team captain, was a three-time leading scorer, and was a three-time MVP. He was also a two-time All-Conference selection, a two-time All-Area selection, a two-time All-State selection, and a two-time All-Midwest selection. In 1975 he was the only player from Illinois to be selected to both the Midwest All-Tournament and All-State teams. Also in 1975, under the guidance of Coach Eric Roy, Mohamed helped lead the Willowbrook Boys Soccer Team to an IHSA Sectional Championship and qualification to the Elite 8 IHSA State Quarterfinals. After High School, Mohamed continued his Soccer career at the University of Illinois Chicago.

Matt Burns

Class of 2014

Matt was a three-sport athlete while at Willowbrook. He was a member of the Football, Boys Basketball, and Boys Track and Field teams. During his time at Willowbrook, his honors included five varsity letters, two-time captain, two-time MVP, Academic All-Conference selection, Daily Herald Prep Sports Excellence Award nominee, and the WBHS Booster Club Most Outstanding Male Athlete award in 2014. In addition to leading the Boys Track and Field team to the WSC Conference Title in 2013, Matt was also the 2013 IHSA State Champion in the 400 Meter Dash. He continues today to hold the Willowbrook Field House record in the 200 Meter Dash. After graduation from Willowbrook, Matt continued his career at the University of Illinois where he earned four varsity letters as a member of the Track and Field Team. His honors also include three-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, two-time Big Ten distinguished Scholar, NCAA Division I National Qualifier 4x400m, Top 20 NCAA Division I 4x400m, three-time Drake Relays Champion, and was a member of the 2015 Big Ten Championship Team. Matt's University of Illinois 4x400m relay ranks #3 all-time in school history.

Susan DeNigris Kane

Class of 1998

Susan's years at Willowbrook as an athlete included being a member of the Girls Volleyball, Girls Basketball, and Girls Track and Field teams. She was named as captain of the Volleyball and Track team while earning seven varsity letters. In 1998, Sue was named as the Booster Club's Most Outstanding Female Senior Athlete. Sue continued her career at North Central College and made an immediate impact. As a Freshman, she contributed to the 4x400-meter relay that won the first-ever National Championship in the History of North Central women's track and field program. She would go on to earn five more All-American certificates in the long jump as well as the 4x100 meter relay. She also qualified for the Division III National Championship competition in the Pole Vault and the 100-meter dash. At the time of her graduation, she held eight track and field records at North Central College. Some of her career highlights include Six-time Division III All-American selection, two-time CCIW Jack Schwartz Academic All-Conference selection, 2002 College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-America selection, and nominee for the NCAA Woman of the Year (encompassing all three NCAA divisions) in 2002. Sue continues to be involved in athletics and currently serves as the Associate Athletic Director and Senior Woman Administrator at North Central College. She was inducted into the North Central Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

Nick Zito

Class of 2013

Swimming was Nick's sport! While on the Boys Swimming and Diving team Nick was named a captain in both 2012 and 2013. His individual accolades include being a seven-time All-Conference selection, three-time IHSA All-State selection, NCSA Junior National Finalist, and All-American selection in the 100 Breast and 200 IM. Nick graduated while holding the school records in the 100 Breast, 200 IM, 100 Fly, 50 Free, and 400 Free-Relay. He also held the West Suburban Conference record in the 100 Breast and was named as a member of the USA Scholastics All-American team. Nick continued his career at the University of Iowa where he would continue to set records. He was named Big Ten Freshman of the week and recorded NCAA "B" Qualifying times in the 100 Breast and 200 IM. Nick's 200 IM is recorded as the fourth-fastest time in program history. He also has the sixth-fastest 100 Breast, ninth-fastest 400 IM, and tenth-fastest 200 Breast in school history. After the University of Iowa, Nick continued to compete. Nick was a member of the US Olympic Team Trials in the 200 and 100 Breast in 2016 and 2020. He was a Semifinalist at the 2016 Olympic Team Trials in the 200 Breast. In the 200 Breast, he finished sixth at the US Nationals Summer of 2016 and second place at the Winter US Nationals. Nick was awarded the Illinois Swimming Athlete of the Year and Illinois Swimming Performance of the Year in 2016 and 2018.

Helen Carpenter

Outstanding Contributor

The name Helen Carpenter has been synonymous with Willowbrook Athletics for over half a century. Helen Carpenter was one of the founding members of the Willowbrook Athletic Boosters Club. She was the first female President of the Athletic Boosters and worked with Willowbrook Athletics since the early 1960s. During Helen's tenure, Willowbrook saw an immediate rise in success as she worked alongside Willowbrook's first Athletic Director and Hall of Fame member John A. Fischer. Some of the types of fundraisers that Helen was involved in included bringing in the Harlem Globetrotters for an exhibition, the Chicago White Sox vs Coaches Basketball Game, and the Chicago Bears season ticket auctions. In honor of Helen Carpenter and her outstanding contributions to Willowbrook High School, the Helen Carpenter Award is awarded annually to the Senior Most Valuable Female Athlete.

Jim White

Class of 1982

Jim White has worn almost every hat you can wear since entering Willowbrook in 1978. He has been a Warrior for the last 44 years in many capacities. As an athlete, Jim was a two-year starter on the Football team under the guidance of Hall of Fame Coach Clint Evans. Jim was the Captain of the Warrior Football team and earned All-Conference selection, All-Area selection, and All-State Honorable Mention. Due to his success as a Warrior football player, Jim earned a football Scholarship to Southern Illinois University where he would play Defensive Tackle. At Southern Illinois University Jim went on to help his team win the Division I-AA (FSB) National Championship. After College Jim joined the Willowbrook staff as a teacher and coach. Jim's pride in Willowbrook is evident in his devotion to Willowbrook and the greater community. Jim's contributions include 31 years of welcoming and supporting incoming students as they learn about our school culture in a program called Progress, 22 years of mentoring students as the Sophomore Class Sponsor, and 25 years of sponsoring the Varsity Club. He also was an announcer for Football, Boys Basketball, and Girls Basketball for 12 years. In 1994 he was honored with the DuPage #88 High School District Outstanding Achievement Award. Jim has been an active coach for the past 34 years in numerous sports including Boys Basketball (12 years), Football (18 years), Boys Track (4 years), Girls Golf (16 years), and Girls Softball (22 years). Jim is currently still teaching and coaching at Willowbrook and continues to instill Pride, Tradition, and excellence in all of his athletes and students.
