





- Debt





# APPLYING TO COLLEGE: STEP 1

### Review application requirements

- ✓ Essays
- **✓**Test Scores
- **✓** Resume
- ✓ Letters of Recommendations

#### Essays:

- Answer the essay question
- English teachers or the Writing Center can be used for essay writing assistance
- If sending same essay to different schools,
   remember to *CHANGE* the **School Name**



## STEP 1 CONTINUED

- Test Scores
  - Go to <u>www.actstudent.org</u> or <u>www.collegeboard.com</u> and send scores directly to college/university (fee required)
  - Should I retake the ACT?
    - Not if you fulfill the requirements of the schools you are considering
  - Retest Statistics:
    - 55% increased, 22% no change, 23% decreased
  - Upcoming ACT test dates
    - September 21 (Registration Deadline: August 23)
    - October 26 (Registration Deadline: September 27)
  - Test Optional Colleges/Universities (<u>www.fairtest.org</u>)
- Have I taken the appropriate exams? Do I need to take the SAT or SAT Subject Tests?
  - Check admission requirements as many highly selective schools recommend or require two or more SAT Subject Tests
  - Upcoming SAT Test Dates
    - October 5 (Registration Deadline: September 6)



## STEP 1 CONTINUED

#### Resume

- Use Naviance to assist with creating resume
- Include all academic, athletic, music, club honors/activities
- Work and Volunteer experience are important also!

#### Letters of Recommendation

- Review admission requirements and determine if letters are required
- Complete Teacher/Counselor Recommendation Form
- Submit Teacher/Counselor Recommendation request on Naviance
- Ask teacher(s) for letter in person. Hand them
   Teacher/Counselor Recommendation Form AND Resume
- Give Teachers/Counselors ample time to complete letter-

#### -2 weeks minimum

# APPLYING TO COLLEGE: STEP 2

- Review admission options (Early Decision, Early Action, Rolling Admission) and requirements
- Complete application-online or by paper (*REFER TO APPLICATION PROCESS HANDOUT*)
- If applying online (not including Common App), do not forget to print off confirmation page or "Secondary School Report or Counselor Signature Page"
- Submit application fee (*Fee waivers* available through counselor)
- Be aware of application deadlines
  - State Schools and Highly Selective....Apply Early!
     (Nov. 1-UIUC, Nov. 15-All other State Schools)
- Apply now, decide later (May 1st)
- Record information in Naviance!!!



## STEP 2 CONTINUED

request your transcript

- Transcript Request
  - Ensure application is complete, collect all letters of recommendation, and send test scores if necessary
  - Request transcript on Naviance (no fee) and track date of submission
  - If you do not use Naviance, you must complete a <u>Transcript</u>
     <u>Request Form</u> (Forms can be located in the Guidance Office) and bring \$3.00/transcript to the Registrar or your Counselor for transcript to be processed and mailed
  - In order to guarantee transcripts will be mailed out by application deadlines-please allow 3 Business Days for processing (Example: Deadline=November 1, Request=October 30)

# WHAT MAKES AN APPLICATION COMPLETE?

- ☐ Online Application
  - Proofread application for errors



- Be sure to click submit button
- ☐ Application Fee submitted with credit card
  - If application <u>fee waiver</u> is needed, please see your counselor
- ☐ Test scores submitted from testing agency
- ☐ Teacher/Counselor letters of recommendation as needed
- ☐ Transcript request

# APPLYING TO COLLEGES-STEP 3 ADMISSION DECISIONS AND FINAL DECISION

- Most schools take 4-6 weeks to process application and respond (Highly Selective will reply in Spring)
- Admission decisions-Admitted, Denied, Waitlist, Under Consideration
- Finish Strong
  - Schools will take all 8 semesters into consideration
  - Schools look for a continued course rigor

# MANAGING APPLICATION ONLINE

- Use appropriate email addresses
- Check email regularly as school will communicate via email with application updates and sometimes decisions
- Keep track of usernames and passwords
- Use Naviance to track date transcript mailed
- Update admission decisions on Naviance



# WHAT IS THE COMMON APPLICATION?

- Group of colleges and universities that have agreed to honor a single application form
- Many of the colleges and universities have their own supplemental forms that must be completed
- Must create username and password and <u>add information to</u>
   <u>Naviance account</u> so documents can be submitted electronically
- Teacher/counselor recommendations are **REQUIRED** and must be submitted through Naviance

- User-friendly
- Submission online required
- Fees required for each school, waivers available (see counselor)
- See Common Application Handout for application steps

## HOW CAN PARENTS HELP WITH THE COLLEGE SELECTION AND APPLICATION PROCESS?

- Visit college fairs and campuses with your student
- Narrow down college search (realistic, reasonable options)
- Review application and essays/personal statements for errors (*Parents should NOT complete these portions for students!*)
- Assist/provide application/transcript fees
- Assist with financial aid paperwork
- Assist with making final decision
- Support the student!


